- Tom want to ensure the Board executes its fiduciary duties related to policy and financial oversight



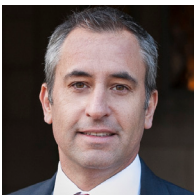
Sally Davis (Incumbent)

David Lane (Incumbent)

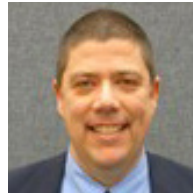
- Two children in LFHS and one in elementary school
